The Glory of God — Randy Morritt

“Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?” (Jn. 11:40) This is the way Jesus responded to Martha’s objection to rolling the stone away from Lazarus’ grave.

What did Martha understand Jesus to be saying? What did she expect to see? Had we been her, what would our expectations be?

Glory is used both as a noun and a verb. As a noun, glory can mean magnificence or great beauty. When used in this sense it normally describes physical or material appearance. Other words conveying the same idea include: splendor, grandeur, majesty, greatness, impressiveness, nobility, elegance, brilliance, splendidness, and other similar words. While such words are usually concretely to describe physical magnificence, they may, at times, be used abstractly to create an impression of magnificence rather than being a literal description of the person or thing under consideration.

A second meaning of glory is high renown or honor won by notable achievements. Other words that convey the concept of glory are: fame, prestige, distinction, eminence, acclaim, praise, recognition, notability, illustriousness, reputation, and other similar ideas.

As a verb, it means to take pride or pleasure in and to laud, praise and honour this in words of or akin to worship whether spoken or felt.

There are some words in our vocabulary such as the word beauty that we can communicate with, not because we can say them, but because we see them. We can point. If we point at enough things and see enough things together and say, “That’s it! “ We might be able to have a common sense of beauty. But when you try to put the word *beauty* into words, it is very, very difficult.

It’s the same thing with the word *glory*.

Defining the Impossible

God is impossible to define and, apart from faith, impossible to understand. He is in a class by himself. God is a spirit (Jn. 4:24) and possesses infinite greatness, and infinite worth.” He is eternal (Ps. 90:2), invisible (Jn. 1:18), immortal, holy (Lev. 11:44), incomparable (Is. 40:18, 25), awesome and majestic (Ex. 15:11), perfect (Matt. 5:48), all-powerful/omnipotent (Is. 40:6, 7), all-knowing/omniscient (Ps. 147:5), everywhere present/omnipresent (Ps. 139:7-21), righteous (Ps. 145:17), unchanging (Mal. 3:6), and gracious. He is the creator and sustainer of all that exists. “. . . From one man, He made every nation of men, that they

should inhabit the whole earth; and he determined the times set for them; and He determined the exact places where they should live. God did this so that men would seek Him and perhaps reach out to Him and find Him, though He is not far from each one of us. For in Him we live and move and have our being. (Acts 17:24-28). He loves us more than we can ever imagine; and gave his one and only Son to die for our sins so that we might be forgiven and have the hope and assurance of eternal life. (Jn. 3:16; Phil. 2:6-8; 1 Tim.1:15). However, He holds us accountable for the way we live; and, someday we will be judged and either rewarded or condemned and punished. (Acts 17:29-31; Rom. 14:9-13; 2 Cor. 5:10) His desire, though, is that all would repent and be saved. (1 Pet. 3:9)

Lae, Papua New Guinea.

Excerpts from her newsletter of March 21, 2020
Greetings and prayers from Lae, Papua New Guinea. I pray that you are well and safe in this time of worldwide turmoil. I wish that I could make this report 100% Covid-19 free, but unfortunately it is affecting even the remotest places on earth, including P.N.G.

The first term classes at the Melanesian Bible College kicked off on February 5th, with lots of excited students – new and returning. The new classrooms were a hit and entered with much appreciation, as was the newly renovated library building. A few of the families were slow in arriving, but eventually we had everyone expected this year, along with several local day students:

Block (term) 1 went well, but block 2 had a shaky start on March 9 and came to a full stop on March 18th, when the M.B.C. school year was cancelled due to the threat of Covid-19. We have been left feeling sorry and a bit dazed by the suddenness of it all, but agree with the decision made by school principal, Jab Mesa, and the Highland church elders, especially as the first case of Covid-19 in P.N.G. (in Lae) was declared last night by Prime Minister Marape. If we had continued through to the end of school in May, it is very likely that our students would have ended up stuck in Lae for an indefinite period, or would have been at greater risk of carrying the virus to their families and communities. Please pray for them, some of whom are still traveling as I write this.

As of today, there are no incoming international flights into Port Moresby, and Australia closed its borders to all foreign citizens yesterday. My scheduled trip home this year will be postponed to the end of the year or to next year, accordingly. I anticipate spending many long hours in the M.B.C. library in coming weeks, and a much quieter year than normal.
