The Blessed

(Part 1)

With the exception of the Lord's Prayer (Matt. 6:9-13) and, perhaps, the "Golden Rule," (Matt. 7:13) Matthew 5:3-12, commonly known as the "Beatitudes", are, probably, the most familiar verses of the Sermon on the Mount. The name "beatitude" is derived from the Latin *beatitudo/beatulus* which is the first word of each of the eight or nine statements (depending on whether one considers verses 11, 12 a separate beatitude or an extension/explanation of verse 10) in the Latin Vulgate. The English word "blessed" is the traditional translation of the Greek word *makarios* which literally means "happy, fortunate, blissful." However, the modern usage of these terms tends to trivialize the meaning by simply suggesting a temporary emotional or circumstantial state, a type of "high", often dependent on one's outward circumstances. Human happiness is something which is dependent on the chances and the changes of life, something life may give and may also destroy. The world can win its joys, and the world can equally well lose its joys. A change in fortune, a collapse in health, the failure of a plan, the disappointment of an ambition, even a change in the weather, can take away the fickle joy the world can give. Therefore, the somewhat ambiguous English "blessed" is still, perhaps, the best term to describe Jesus' statements.

Blessed speaks of more than a surface emotion. It is an incredibly special word describing the gods. In Christianity there is a godlike joy. Blessed refers to the ultimate well-being and distinctive spiritual joy of those who share in the kingdom of God, the divinely

bestowed well-being that belongs only to the faithful. William Barclay writes: "The meaning of *makarios* can best be seen from one particular usage of it. The Greeks always called Cyprus *he makaria* The Happy Isle. They did so because they believed that Cyprus was so lovely, so rich, and so fertile an island that a man would never need to go beyond its coastline to find the perfectly happy life. It had such a climate, such flowers and fruits and trees, such minerals, such natural resources that it contained within itself all the materials for perfect happiness." (The Daily Study Bible-Matthew)

The Beatitudes demonstrate that the way to heavenly blessedness is incompatible to and inconsistent with the worldly path normally followed that seeks happiness in riches, merriment, abundance, leisure, and such things. They speak of that joy which seeks us through our pain, that joy which sorrow and loss, and pain and grief, are powerless to touch, that joy which shines through tears, and which nothing in life or death can take away. Christian blessedness is completely untouchable and unassailable. "No one," said Jesus, "will take your joy from you" (John 16:22). The Christian has the serene and untouchable joy which comes from walking forever in the company and in the presence of Jesus Christ.


Returning to the Church Building.

Jesus Heals a Paralytic

Mark 2

2 And when he returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. 2 And many were gathered together, so that there was no more room, not even at the door. And he was preaching the word to them. 3 And they came, bringing to him a paralytic carried by four men. 4 And when they could not get near him because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him, and when they had made an opening, they let down the bed on which the paralytic lay. 5 And when Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven." 6 Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, 7 "Why does this man speak like that? He is blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" 8 And immediately Jesus, perceiving in his spirit that they thus questioned within themselves, said to them, "Why do you question these things in your hearts? 9 Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your bed and walk'? 10 But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he said to the paralytic— 11 "I say to you, rise, pick up your bed, and go home." 12 And he rose and immediately picked up his bed and went out before them all, so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We never saw anything like this!"
